# Policy Change in Dealing With Head Injuries

Please note that we are no longer required to immediately place a 911 call if someone hits their head on the ice. The severity of the injury needs to be assessed in consultation, if possible, with the injured person.

MCC has created signage posted inside the curling rink that lists when to call 911. It is on the third sheet wall just inside the door. If you have hit your head and feel ok, we recommend you take a picture of the sign or keep this page of the newsletter for reference. It lists the symptoms to watch for.



# **Concussion Alert**



**RED FLAGS** ARE AN **EMERGENCY. CALL 911**.

BE VIGILANT (SEEK MEDICAL ATTENTION IF ANY OF THESE SYMPTOMS APPEAR)

### **CALL 911 IF:**

- LOSS OF CONSCIOUSNESS (KNOCKED OUT)
- NECK PAIN OR TENDERNESS
- DOUBLE VISION
- WEAKNESS OR TINGLING IN ARMS OR LEGS
- SEVERE OR INCREASING HEADACHE
- SEIZURE OR CONVULSION
- VOMITING MORE THAN ONCE
- INCREASINGLY RESTLESS, AGITATED OR AGGRESSIVE
- GETTING MORE AND MORE CONFUSED



### **RECOGNIZE SYMPTOMS**

#### PHYSICAL:

- HEADACHE
- PRESSURE IN THE HEAD
- DIZZINESS
- NAUSEA OR VOMITING
- BLURRED VISION
- SENSITIVITY TO LIGHT OR SOUND
- RINGING IN THE EARS
- BALANCE PROBLEMS
- TIRED OR LOW ENERGY
- DROWSINESS
- DON'T FEEL RIGHT"

- NERVOUS OR ANXIOUS
