# FREE GUARD ZONE (FGZ) & FIVE ROCK RULE

The FGZ is the area between the hog line and the tee line, excluding the house.

If, prior to the delivery of the sixth stone of an end, a delivered stone causes, either directly or indirectly, an opposition stone to be moved from the FGZ to an out-of-play position, then the delivered stone is removed from play, and any displaced stones are replaced, by the non-offending team, to their positions prior to the violation taking place.

#### So to highlight the specifics:

- 1. The 6th rock is the first rock that can remove an "opponents" rock in the free guard zone.
- 2. This applies to only opponents rocks you can remove your own rock.
- 3. A rock removed in error must be replaced "without exception".

### **SCENTS**

### SPARING

#### The Charge for Sparing

Questions have circulated about paying to spare, and whether full members should pay to spare Tuesday/Thursday morning or Saturday night. It should be noted that Tuesday/Thursday morning or Saturday night do not have fixed teams. So curling in those time slots is not really sparing – you are not replacing someone who has already paid as you would be in a league with fixed teams.

As a reminder, Social Members and non-members can spare up to 3 times in a year and are expected to pay \$10 for those 3 times.

This works very much on an honour system. If need be, the board could send a "reminder" to members who don't seem to be "honouring" the system.

#### **Current Policy:**

Any persons who wish to curl in a league without fixed teams, who have not paid for that league, should pay \$10 at the bar. This includes full members.

Also, \$10 for a single game may not be too little, in comparison to what it costs to register for a league. The board will review this price for next year.

### STANLEY CUP



Many of you will have seen the photos of the Stanley Cup at our Club last Saturday – Nov. 17th. You may also wonder why there wasn't a general notification for those who wished to be there.

This was not a club function; this was a private rental of the club's lounge area. We were told to expect at least 100 persons.

So there was concern that it would be a zoo – and it was. Also, we were concerned about breaking the fire code for maximum individuals in the building. So, knowing that there would be some "word of mouth" we didn't send a general notification.
