Clarification Re Spares & Guests

It is hoped that the following information will clarify when a member or non-member is considered a guest and when they are a spare.

Any person who is not a member of the Manotick Curling Club must sign a Waiver before playing in one of our leagues. Waivers can be found in the blue file folder marked "informed consent", located in the tower on the table next to the display case. The form should be handed in to the bar. It only needs to be submitted once per season.

As of January 1st the fee for non-members to play will increase from \$10 to \$15 per game. This should be paid at the bar.

Anyone who participates in a show-and-play league is a guest if they are not a registered member of that league. The 3 show-and-play leagues are the Tuesday and Thursday morning leagues and the Saturday evening league. It should be emphasized that the term guest applies to Manotick members as well as non-members. As of January 1st the guest fee will also increase from \$10 to \$15.

A spare is defined as anyone who replaces a regular player in the fixed leagues. There is no fee for sparing if the spare is a member of the Manotick Curling Club. Otherwise they must sign the consent form and pay the non-member fee.

Last year, her team won the Women's U18 Provincials and they also brought home a Silver medal at the U18 Nationals. Manotick Curling Club

Grand Spiel

In March and April, a new event is planned for the Evening Leagues. It will be called the Grand Spiel. Please review the eligibility rules and sign up at the earliest opportunity.

Eligibility

- All adult members of Manotick Curling Club
- Priority will be given to Sunday Colts, Monday / Wednesday / Thursday evening Leagues
- Priority status is given because those Leagues are giving up their March ice time
- A spares list will be established

When is it played

- Starting March 4 and ending with Finals on April 7
- Depending on your win/loss record you may play on Sunday, Monday, Wednesday, or Thursday evening
- The Grand Spiel will replace the "fun format" games typically played in March after League play is finished. Sign up to keep your curling season going!
- No Grand Spiel games will be scheduled during March Break, or City of Ottawa, or Closing Spiel play.

Skips Draft

- Skips will be "recruited" for their participation
- A Draft will be held on Sat February 15 at 2 pm, by skips, to pick their team for the Grand Spiel
- The 32 skips will pick from a pool of players (96 members) by lottery. They will choose in order and then reverse order until 64 players plus 32 skips are on teams e.g. the 32nd pick will also have the 33rd pick



- A second lottery will be held to select the last 32 players.
- Selected players may play in any position on the team regardless of the order of selection
- Skips may select players personally, or by proxy if unable to attend the draft

Format

- This is an in-club spiel with some of the strongest players in the club participating; a chance to learn and develop newer curlers while competing for a major club award.
- This will be a 32 team 128 player bonspiel
- Teams will be placed on a playdown ladder with win/loss records determining when and where they will play their next game
- It will be a four-game knockout format, provided it is full.
- Win/loss records will determine a team's Division for Finals on April 7

Extravaganza Night

- The Best (arguably) party of the year at Manotick Curling Club
- Cocktail Party atmosphere
- Lots of great curling to watch as the Finals are played on the ice
- Cocktail foods with Chef Shillington as the Barbecue Master
- Unequalled bar service
- Bagpiper, a parade of curling Finalists, pomp and circumstance
- Short speeches
- League Awards, Grand Spiel Trophies, Recognition for performance throughout the year; all presented by the Club President
- Extravaganza Night sign up will be separate from Grand Spiel sign-up

How do I sign up for the Grand Spiel?

- Sign-up will be on the website under "Events"
- Any member may sign up but priority will be given to the 4 Evening League members
- The deadline for Sun/Mon/Wed/Thur evening leagues will be Feb 8
- Remaining spots (if any) will be filled with other curling club members in order of their on-line sign up. We also hope to have a lengthy spare list.
- It is **strongly suggested** that all spares be taken from the spares list rather than from other teams - it's only fair- and that suggestion lines up with the goals of this spiel - to integrate newer curlers into League play.
